

Curriculum

Our Lower School curriculum is theme based and covers the spectrum of the WA Curriculum, with a strong focus on literacy and numeracy. Underpinning all areas of the curriculum is the teaching of social and emotional skills, Protective Behaviours and Lifeskills.

PBS

As a Positive Behaviour School we believe in explicitly teaching students positive behaviours that link to our school expectations. We routinely teach, recognise and celebrate students as they display expected positive behaviours.

Community Work Centres

Our Upper School curriculum provides many opportunites for students to learn employability skills. With four community work centres in the local Bunbury area we teach skills in agriculture, manufacturing, office and retail environments.

Workplace Learning

Upper school students embed work skills by undertaking workplace learning in the local community. Supported by staff, students could spend one day a week in an open workplace.

Student Wellbeing

Our Student Wellbeing team work together to provide the best support for students to be able to access their learning. The team work with staff and students to encourage positive behaviours, as well as provide a regulation space when required. Breakfast club is designed to provide connection and regulation time to set students up for the day. Our mentoring program allows students to get more individualised support.

Transport

The school bus service is provided by the Public Transport Authority. Students who are enrolled at Newton Moore ESC may be eligible for the free School Bus Service. The service needs to be applied for and is offered separate from the school.



Transition

Students and families are supported at both their transition into NMESC and in leaving NMESC. Through a person centred approach we build on students' strengths and aims to find the best setting for them while in school and then to start their journey when leaving school..

Eligibility

Education support enrolment criteria for Preprimary to Year 12 students are:

- evidence that the intellectual disability, physical disability, or autism diagnosis demonstrates eligibility for an individual disability allocation;
- the disability and any co-existing conditions result in a substantially reduced functional capacity to learn that is expected to be lifelong; and
- a substantial or extensive level of adjustment is required to provide an appropriate education program.

- Eligibility to be established; -Diagnosis -School Visit -Lead School Psychologist consult.
 - Enrolment approved.
 - School enrolment paperwork completed
 - Person Centred Plan conducted
 - Transition timetable.
